Greetings to all as we start a new year and chapter in the story of the Association of Army Dentistry, and Happy 112th Birthday to the Army Dental Corps!



The Army Dentistry Monument Dedication

The Association of Army Dentistry (AAD) will dedicate the Army Dentistry Monument on Friday, March 24, 2023, in a ceremony at the U.S. Army Medical Department (AMEDD) Museum in San Antonio, Texas. The Monument is a lasting tribute to all Soldiers, civilians, and spouses who have served and continue to serve in the U.S. Army Dental Care System in support of the U.S. Army, the military mission, and our Nation. The Monument recognizes and honors the selfless service of the diverse members of the Army Dental Care System.

The dedication ceremony culminates six years of design, construction, fund raising, and persistently overcoming mountains of administrative and logistical hurdles. The monument is composed of three bronze figures partially surrounded by nine granite monoliths. The bronze sculpture depicts a dental officer, dental assistant, and patient in a field setting, highlighting the primary mission of Army Dentistry, caring for Soldiers in any location, at any time. The bronze sculptures are the creations of artisans Stan Watts and Tami Brooks of Atlas Bronze, Kearns, Utah, using an initial design sketched by illustrator, Jorden Pao. The individual granite monoliths recognize the various components and aspects of Army Dentistry; Non-Commissioned Officers (NCOs) and enlisted Soldiers, civilians, spouses and volunteers, dental laboratory services, dental research, education and training, leadership, and the U.S. Army dental history. The name plates and the likenesses of the three bronze figures honor the diversity of key personnel that are represented in Army Dentistry: the father of Army Dentistry, Dr John Marshall, the only Army Dentistry Medal of Honor recipient, Captain Ben Salomon, and African American and female pioneers, Dr. William Birch, and Dr. Leonie von Zasch, respectively. The back wall will have several bronze plagues acknowledging the people and organizations that have donated their time, talents, and funds to this project.

The Association of Army Dentistry, founded in 2009, is focused on keeping the legacy of the Army Dental Corps alive and preserving its rich history in order to inspire those who choose to serve and support the nation's military. The Army

Dentistry Monument Dedication commemorates this unique contribution to the U.S. Army and the Nation and will stand in perpetuity. Membership in the AAD is open to all active and former servicemembers from all branches and services, and to all civilians and family members associated with the Army Dental Care System. The mission and goals of the AAD are to promote, support and recognize individuals, organizations, and activities within the Army Dental Care System, while at the same time ensuring our rich history is preserved. The AAD works closely with the Active and Reserve components on all levels and stands ready to offer its support whenever possible. Furthermore, the AAD seeks to further foster the already solid relationship between military dentistry and organized dentistry and promote the benefit and value of Army Dentistry. Lastly, the AAD stands in support of its members and all those affiliated with Army Dentistry and continues to develop new avenues of support.

AAD Strategic Pillars

AAD Dental CE Initiative

On February 28th, Dr. Michael Cuenin and Dr. Theresa Gonzales initiated contact (virtually) with the Commander, Dental Health Command Europe (DHCE), Colonel Scott Rankin. DHCE stood up in 2016, replacing the former Europe Regional Dental Command (ERDC). DHCE Headquarters is located at Sembach, Germany and is a subordinate unit of the United States Army Regional Health Command Europe (RHCE). DHCE provides sustained dental services in support of the forces in U.S. Army Europe, U.S. Army Central and U.S. Army Africa to enable readiness and conserve the fighting strength while caring for Families and Soldiers for Life.



Drs. Cuenin and Gonzales are part of the Dental Education initiative of the Association of Army Dentistry Board of Directors along with Dr. Rob Temple. COL Rankin, along with DHCE Continuing Education (CE) Officer, Captain Shane Hansen, discussed how the AAD can best support Army Dentists overseas. The group decided that the way ahead is for the Command staff to canvas the Dental Corps Officers of the DHCE regarding their preference for continuing education subject matter. The AAD Dental Education Initiative Task Force will then be soliciting input from AAD members who would like to provide virtual lectures on the desired topics to this next generation of Dental Corps Officers. We will keep the membership updated on this initiative as it takes shape.

Note: Regional Health Command Europe was redesignated as Medical Readiness Command Europe (MRC, EUR) on 1 October 2022.

Honoring Service

Selfless service is one of the seven Army Values and one to which we should all aspire. Many of us contribute much of our time, talent, and treasure throughout our military careers and beyond. Recently, two such exemplary Army Dental Corps Officers did just that – gave of their time and talent to assist those in need.

COL (RET) Dr. Christiansen Sicat Hsu is not new to advocating for humanitarian missions. Currently a practicing oral and maxillofacial surgeon in Bonsall, California, Dr. Hsu served 21 years Active Duty in the Army Dental Corps as well as the Navy Dental Corps. As a young Naval Officer in 2004, she participated in her first humanitarian mission in her homeland of the Philippines. Fast forward to 2015, while serving as a COL in the Army, she led a successful multinational and multifunctional team supporting the Navy-hosted Pacific Partnership Humanitarian Exercise. Over the course of four months, COL Hsu and 54 other healthcare providers conducted more than 250 global health engagements in the South Pacific and Southeast Asia.

Her military career, her skills, her passion, and her spirit of giving enabled her to develop a well-organized five-day mission to the Philippines from 20-25 February 2023. Under the auspices of the Metropolitan Humanitarian Foundation, her family and two fellow oral and maxillofacial surgeons spent five days visiting Santa Rita, Pampanga and Olongapo where they rendered dental triage, extractions, oral hygiene education, medical care and optical services to more than 2300 villagers! Over three hundred children were given oral hygiene kits. The team also spent a day at Our Lady of Peace Charity Hospital, where Dr. Hsu and her team donated supplies and a patient monitor to support cleft surgeries at that facility. To identify future opportunities for volunteers, her team and she met with hospital leadership at the Rosario Medical Center in Guagua, located near her hometown of Santa Rita.

In addition to all the medical and dental care rendered, the team had the opportunity to participate in cultural and historical opportunities. The pinnacle of their trip was a four-hour trek to the famous Mount Pinatubo volcano in Pampanga. They also visited Mt Samat National Shrine, dedicated to the fallen Filipinos and Americans during World War II. They remembered the tragic 1942 Bataan Death March where over 70,000 American and Filipino Soldiers were forced to march 65 miles across the Filipino peninsula to a POW encampment. Many were already sick with dysentery or weakened from malaria and suffered horrible deaths. It is a testament to their inner strength and faith that so many did survive. At White Sands, New Mexico, this forced road march is annually commemorated each March with the 26.2 mile Bataan Memorial Death March with participants from all over the military and world. Until just a few years ago, survivors would be recognized before the start of the event, and then participants could greet these remarkable men. COL(Ret) Hsu's grandfather was one of these remarkable Soldiers.

So many were positively impacted by the dedicated and passionate team of Filipino and American volunteers with Dr. Hsu and her team during this humanitarian mission, which will now be conducted annually every February. Army Reserve Soldiers often face the challenge of balancing Army obligations, professional careers, and their family life. This is true for LTC Takashi Komabayashi, an endodontist with the 810th Dental Company Area Support (DCAS) in Cary, North Carolina.

LTC Komabayashi began his Army career as a dental officer with the 965th DCAS in Seagoville, Texas in 2010. He served as the Executive Officer for the 455th DCAS at Devens,

Massachusetts when he moved to the New England area in 2015. LTC Komabayashi mobilized in 2020 to perform endodontic treatment and comprehensive dental evaluations to Soldiers at the Fort Bliss mobilization site. He is a graduate of the Command and General Staff Officer Course. LTC Komabayashi received his Doctor of Dental Surgery Degree from Hiroshima University in Japan. In 2005, he received his U.S. dental degree from the University of California in San Francisco. He graduated from the University of Connecticut with an Endodontic certificate and a Master of Dental Science degree. Additionally, the University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center in Dallas awarded him an M.S. in Clinical Science.

A firm believer in the value of education, LTC Komabayashi shares his passion for learning with his students. He is the Director of the Graduate Endodontic program at the University of North Carolina, Adams School of Dentistry in Chapel Hill. He also engages in research where he currently focuses on evaluating endodontic sealer performance at the dentin interface using advanced imaging technology. His interests include applying ultramodern research to the clinical setting to achieve excellent patient care with innovative and cost-effective materials and procedures.

LTC Komabayashi maintains balance between his Army and dental career by fostering a can-do atmosphere and promoting esprit-de-corps in both the dental school and in his Army unit. He shows a high degree of professionalism and leadership qualities that motivate both his students and his Soldiers. In return, he receives a lot of support from the University and his family especially during his mobilization. LTC Komabayashi lives in North Carolina with his wife, son, and twin daughters.
